"Long-term perspectives on higher education, organization, and society workshop"

March 21-23, 2023 in Jerusalem and Ein Karem, Israel

A group of 17 social scientists from Australia, Canada, Germany, Israel, Sweden, the United States, the United Arab Emirates, and South Africa met at the end of March in the cloister of Notre Dame de Sion in Ein Karem near Jerusalem to debate and work on "long-term perspectives on higher education, organization, and society." At the core of the workshop were working groups on the relationship between university and society, science and society, university governance and management, space and place in science and higher education, and climate change and sustainability. These working groups spent three days discussing and working on decisive developments and future research perspectives, which might shape the agenda for the next one to two decades. The results will be presented in a written format soon, and it is planned to continue working on these topics in another workshop in the future.
